Whereas, a petition signed by M. B. Wilson and 70 others of the citizens and taxpayers of Union, Union County, Oregon, and vicinity, has been filed with the clerk of the Court praying for the laying out, establishing and opening a county road within Union County, Oregon, under the provisions of Sections 26 to 28 inclusive of Chapter 295 Session Laws of 1917, upon the following line, viz:

Commencing at the Southwest corner of the Northwest quarter of section eighteen (18) Township Four (4) South of Range Forty (40) E.W.M, thence along the Range line between Ranges thirty nine and forty E.W.M. in accordance with survey and as staked upon the ground by State Engineer Glass, to a point at or near the Northwest corner of section seven (7) said Township and Range first above mentioned, said road to be sixty feet in width,
