


To the Honorable County Court,

M., all of which lies in the S. $\frac{1}{2}$ of said Sections 5 & 6 in said Tp. 4, S. R. 39 E.

said report having been continued from term to term since June 4th, 1919 until this time, and it appearing to the Court from the report of the County Surveyor that the portion of said road proposed to be vacated is burdensome to maintain and is no longer practical or useful to the traveling public for the reason that new roads have been laid out in the same vicinity

which are more practical, and it further appearing from the affidavit of posting on file that the County Surveyor more than thirty days prior to June 4th, 1919, the date set for hearing said Surveyor's Report, posted three notices of the date set for hearing said report in the vicinity of the road proposed to be vacated, and one notice at the place of holding County Court, and that said notices remained posted at least thirty days before the date set for hearing, and it further appearing that no person has appeared to object to the vacation of said road, and that no remonstrance has been filed,

It is therefore CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that said road be and the same is hereby vacated between the points along the line described above.

In the matter of the appointment of a County Road Master

Now at this time this matter comes on to be heard for the appointment of a County Road Master, and it appearing to the court that John F. Birney is an engineer with a long experience and a competent road builder and is well recommended,

It is therefore CONSIDERED AND ORDERED that John F. Birney be and he is hereby appointed Road Master of Union County, Oregon, for the term of one year, beginning January 1st, 1920, and his salary is hereby fixed at the sum of \$300.00 per month. It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said John F. Birney furnish a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$2500.00 conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duty.

In the matter of the refund of taxes erroneously collected by School District No. 5, and the City of Union

Now at this time the above entitled matter comes on to be heard upon the petition of W. J. Townley praying that certain taxes erroneously levied against his personal property by School District No. 5, and the City of Union, for the year 1918, be refunded, and it appearing to the court from said petition that fifty head of cattle owned by petitioner were assessed within the limits of School District No. 5, and the City of Union at \$3750.00, when in fact, but ten head of cattle of the value of \$750.00 should have been assessed within said school district and city; that the city of Union collected a tax to which it was not entitled on a valuation of \$5000.00, or the sum of \$40.50; that School District No. 5 collected a tax to which it was not entitled on the same valuation, or the sum of \$30.60; that said forty head of cattle of the value of \$5000.00 erroneously assessed in School District No. 5 should have been assessed in School District No. 61 and taxes levied against said cattle by said School District No. 61 in the sum of \$3.60, and it further appearing to the court that Chapter 237 of the laws of Oregon for the year 1919 provides for the refund of taxes levied by a taxing district or tax levying body against real or personal property not within the jurisdiction of such taxing district,

It is therefore CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the sum of \$67.50 be refunded
