In the matter of the claim of G. W. De Lay for indemnity for diseased cattle slaughtered under the provisions of Chapter 14, Laws of 1913.

Now at this time is presented to the Court the claim of G. W. De Lay in the sum of \$75.00 as indemnity for one registered cow and one registered bull, slaughtered under the provisions of Chapter 14, Laws of 1913; and it appearing to the Court from the record and the certificate of Dr. Fred A. Barber, the veterinarian supervising the slaughter, that said animals werekilled on October 26, 1920, and from the affidavit of G. W. De Lay, the claimant, that said animals were owned in the State of Oregon the required length of time to come under the provisions of this act, and that all requirements relative to disinfecting the premises whether said animals were kept, have been complied with, and no one appearing to resist said claim,

It is therefore CONSIDERED AND ORDERED that the same be and is hereby allowed in the sum of \$75.00, and the County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant on the General Fund of the County in favor of the said G. W. De Lay in the sum of \$37.50, said amount being one half of the claim and the amount to be paid by Union County.
