NOTICE OF ROAD PETITION

TO ALL PERSONS CONCERNED: You and each and all of you, will take notice that the undersigned freeholders of Union County, Oregon, residing in the road district where the hereinafter described road is proposed to be, will at the next session of the County Court for Union county, Oregon, to-wit: on Wednesday, the 6 day of December A. D., 1922, respectfully present to said court a petition praying said court to lay out, alter and establish a County Road within said county, on the following line, or route, to-wit:

Commencing at a point One Hundred Ten (110) rods West of the Northeast corner of Section 34, Township 2 North Range 40 East of the Willamette Meridian and about 30 rods West of what is known as the "Sam Thompson House" thence running South along the West side of the Canyon a distance about one and one-eighth mile to the residence of George Yarrington, thence crossing to the East side of the Canyon thence running on the East side of the Canyon along the most practicable route a distance about three fourths of a mile to the Highway, terminating on said Highway at a point about twenty rods below the "Matt Boswell barn", The road to be 60 feet wide. A public necessity for this road exists in that it will afford a better grade than that now in use, and it will also afford five miles more of highway for public travel.

It is therefore CONSIDERED AND ORDERED that said transfer of funds be and the same is hereby authorized and the County Clerk and County Treasurer are hereby directed to make the necessary entries upon the books of their respective offices showing said transfer.

In the matter of the application of Sallie White for County Aid.

Now at this time it is ORDERED that this matter be and the same is hereby continued for investigation.

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In the matter of the proposed County Road petitioned for by John B. Scott, et al.

Now at this time the above entitled matter came on for final action upon the report of the Board of County Road Viewers, heretofore filed herein, said report having been publicly read on two separate days of this term of Court, to-wit: May 2nd and 3rd, and continued until this time for final action, said report being in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

"REPORT OF BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD VIEWERS

To the Honorable County Court for Union County, Oregon:

The undersigned Board of County Road Viewers, heretofore on the Eighth day of February, 1923, instructed to view, lay out, and alter the proposed county road, of which the survey hereto attached is a true and correct description, as petitioned for by John B. Scott, et al., beg leave to report that on the 19th day of April, 1923, in pursuance with said order, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinions said proposed road should be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon; that the same is practicable and would add to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof. We therefore recommend that said proposed road be laid out and declared a public highway of said county and that no damages be allowed for the right-of-way for the proposed road.

And it appearing to the Court that said Board of County Road Viewers is favorable and that they recommend that said proposed road be established as a County Road and declared a public highway of Union County, Oregon, and all the proceedings herein having been legal and according to law and no remonstrance or claim for damages having been filed, and there having been no cause shown why this proposed road should not be declared a public highway and ordered open;

And the Court being satisfied from the report of the viewers that said road will be of public utility,

It is therefore CONSIDERED AND ORDERED that said report be accepted and placed on record in the journal of this Court and that the Surveyor's profile and plat of the proposed road and his field notes of the survey thereof be placed on record in the book of plats of County Roads of Union County, Oregon, and that said proposed road be and the same is hereby declared a public highway of Union County, Oregon.

Thereupon the Journal of the day's proceedings was read, approved, and is here now signed, and it was ORDERED that Court be now adjourned for the term.
