the expence of opening said road will be so

great that it might not to be granted
- unless opened and put in good traveling
condition by the petitioners.

would most respectfully remonstrate
against the granting of a petition of
Wm L Mortzger and others praying
the Location of a County road diverging
from the La Grande and Cove Road ^{near}
the residence of Widow Kauluck ^{Running} thence,
South East one mile to the grade,

thence on said grade to the summit
of W L Mortzger's for the following reasons

1st It angles through the farm of Widow
Kauluck's

2nd This Cove road is located as far
as Cochran's Mill (1 mile above the proposed
divergence,

3rd By diverging from said road at
or near Cochran's Mill the road will
ingress no one and be on as good ^{near} ground

4th Therefore we cannot see the justice
in taking the boundaries out of any body's
farm when it can be avoided
