In the matter of the discontinuance of the election precinct known as "Palmer Precinct".

Now at this time this matter comes on for hearing, this being the time fixed by statute for the establishing of election precincts, and it appearing to the Court that the population of Palmer Precinct has decreased until but a small number of voters reside in said precinct, and it further appearing that the cost of holding an election in said precinct is excessive considering the number of voters residing therein, and it further appearing that most of said voters would not be greatly inconvenienced if required to cast their vote in Elgin Precinct No. 1,

It is CONSIDERED AND ORDERED that the election precinct known as Palmer Precinct be and the same is hereby discontinued and the boundaries of Elgin Precinct No. 1 shall be fixed as follows:

In the matter of the proposed County road petitioned for by F. A. Tobrocke, Et al.

Now at this time is presented to the Court the petition of F. A. Tobrocke, et al., for a proposed county road described as follows: commencing at a point on the present County Road near the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of Section 1 in Township 1 South, Range 39 EWM, thence running in a northwesterly direction following down Shaw Creek along the practical route, to a point where the present county road crosses Shaw Creek, being a distance of approximately one half mile, and the Court having inspected said petition together with the proceedings connected therewith, finds that the petitioners have not filed a bond to cover the costs of said road proceedings as required by law,

It is therefore CONSIDERED AND ORDERED that said petition be and the same is hereby continued for the term.

In the matter of the vacation of a portion of County Road No. 371.

WHEREAS, it appears to the County Court of Union County, Oregon, that a portion of the County Road No. 371, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point as described in the original notes as A 66 said point being on the section line between sections 25 and 22 T 2 S, R 36, EWM, said point being approximately 25 chs. south of the section corner common to sections 23, 24, 25 & 26 T 2 S, R 36 EWM; thence in a northwesterly direction

Now at this time is presented to the Court the deed of Joseph Ott to a right-of-way for a county road, described as follows; That certain strip of land forty (40) feet in width, being twenty (20) feet on each side of that certain line, which is particularly described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the northwest corner of section thirty (30) in Township Two (2) north, of range forty (40) EWM, and running thence south 13° 42' east a distance of 345 feet; thence south 26° 06' east a distance of 100 feet; thence south 36° 05' east a distance of 920 feet; thence south 54° 18' east a distance of 815 feet, to intersect with the present county road; which point of intersection is approximately 1650 feet south and 1320 feet east of the point of beginning, containing two acres, more or less; and it appearing to the Court that said deed is in due form and that the land described therein is required as a right-of-way for a county road for the convenience of persons residing in the vicinity of said road,
