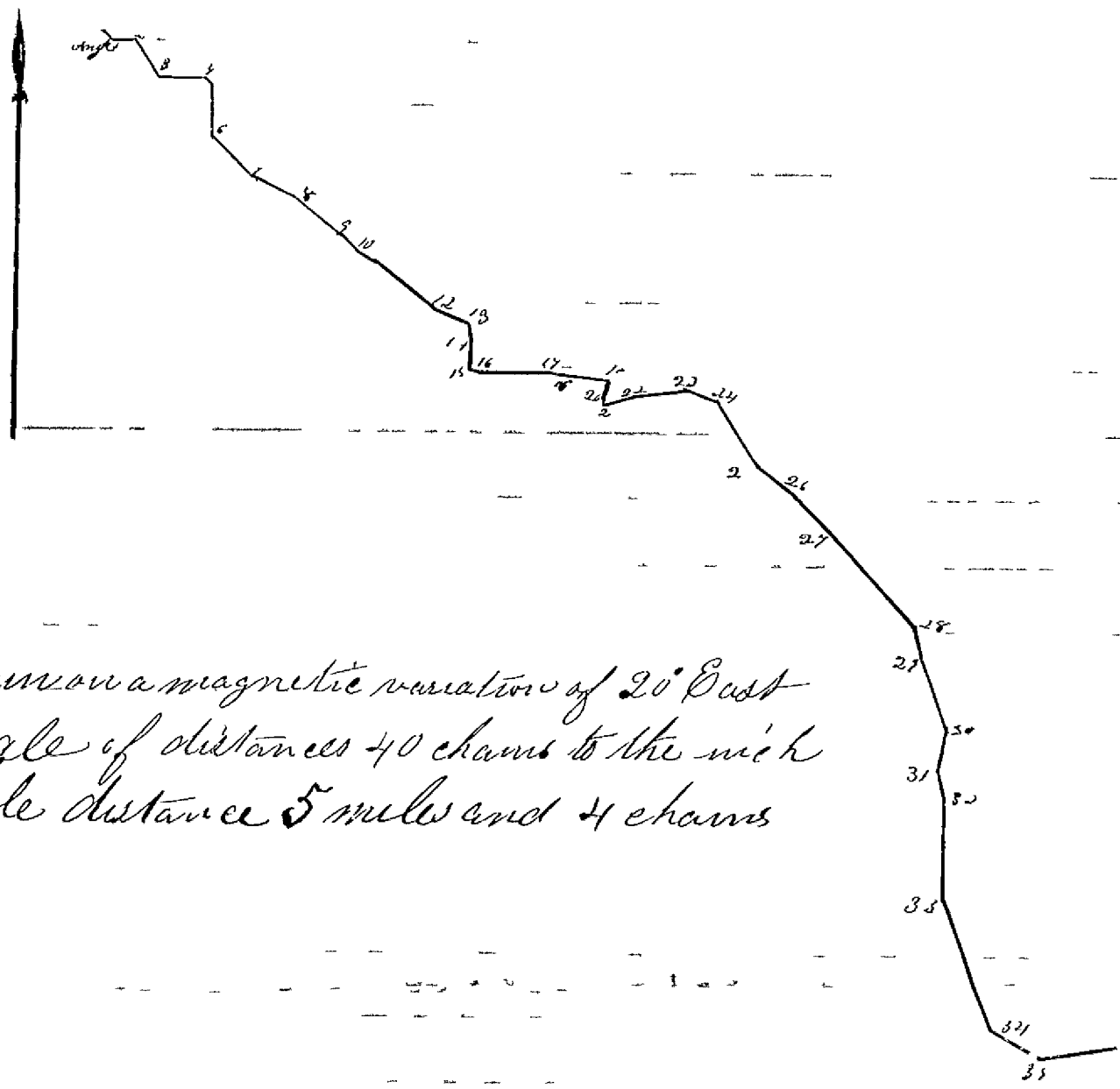

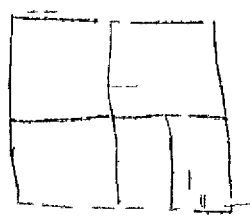

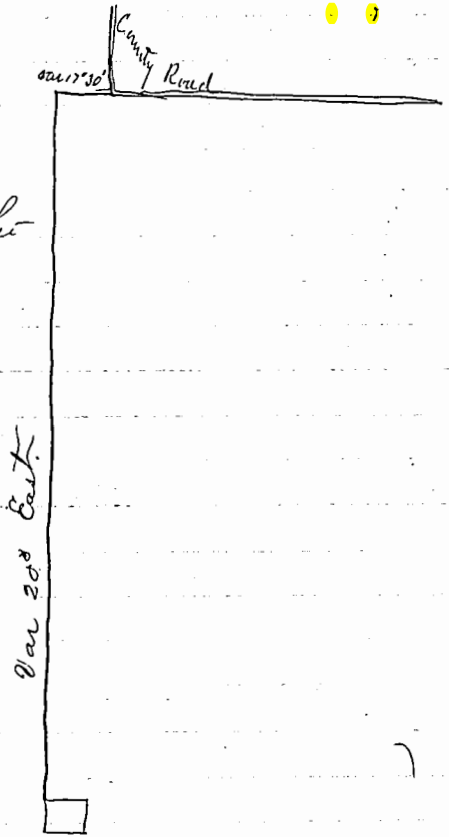

This matter came on to be heard at this time on the petition of Elisha Cotto, for license to sell spirituous, malt and vinous liquors in less quantities than one gallon in Converse Precinct, and it appears to the Court that his petition is signed by an actual majority of all the legal voters of said Precinct, and that the notice has been published for four consecutive weeks as by law required, proof of which has been filed herein. That the said petitioner has paid in to the County Treasurer the sum of \$100 as required by law,
