WHEREAS, 100% of Union County is currently experiencing drought conditions, with approximately 50% of the County classified in Severe Drought status by the U.S. Drought Monitor; and

WHEREAS, seasonal outlooks from the National Climate Prediction Center forecast drier and warmer than average conditions for the coming months; and

WHEREAS, if these conditions persist as forecasted, Union County's agricultural industry faces the potential for significant economic loss, increased risk of injury, and damage to property due to extreme weather; and

WHEREAS, the Union County Board of Commissioners finds it necessary to take action to alleviate suffering among residents and livestock, to mitigate economic hardship, and to respond proactively to the elevated risk of wildfire.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Union County Board of Commissioners, under the emergency powers granted by ORS 401.309, hereby declares a local STATE OF EMERGENCY within Union County due to ongoing and forecasted drought conditions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Union County Board of Commissioners requests that the Governor of the State of Oregon declare a STATE OF EMERGENCY in Union County due to drought and extend assistance to local agricultural producers, including access to State and Federal grants, loans, and other forms of financial assistance available to support affected residents and mitigate ongoing impacts.
